In 1821, Danjuro VII dedicated the first Gakudo Hall on the grounds of Naritasan (burned down in 1965). At the main entrance he placed a sign with the word "Settaijo"

The kabuki actor Danjuro Ichikawa, who also played a role in Narita Fudo religion was fated to always remain a part of Narita. Danjuro I was born in old Edo (Tokyo), the son of Juzo Horikoshi, a native of Narita's Hataya district. After his first stage performance in 1673, he quickly became one of the most popular actors in Edo. However, childless, he went to Naritasan Shinshoji Temple to pray for a child. After being blessed with a child, he acted in a drama in celebration of the temple which became a big hit. That is how Narita-ya became his family stage name. The actions of Danjuro spread the word about the deity Narita Fudo to the masses, and pilgrimages of ordinary citizens of Edo to Naritasan became very popular. Danjuro VII who became the successor to the name at the age of 10, was a famous actor who had become staggeringly popular among Exiled from Old Edo during the Tempo Revolution which he went to live at Naritasan's Enmeiin Temple. Since the middle Edo Period, the Ichikawa family has been connected with Narita-san Shinshoji Temple through the religion of Fudo. Kabuki actor Danjurou Ichikawa, who is well-known to the people of Narita because he has often come to the city to, for example, the 13th generation Danjurou Ichikawa Hakuzen's name announcement ceremony or the Setsubun Close-of-Winter Festival, was named "Narita Brand Ambassador." Through Danjurou's work in helping to continue Japan's traditional performing arts and culture, he is spreading the word about Narita's attractions.


