

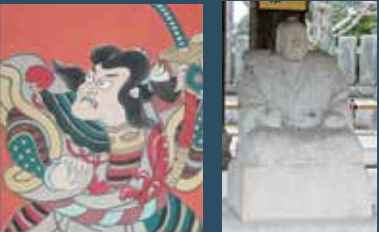

In 1821, Danjuro VII dedicated the first Gakudo Hall on the grounds of Naritasan (burned down in 1965). At the main entrance he placed a sign with the word "Setaijo" ("Reception Desk") which always amused visitors. (The photo is of the 2nd (current) Gakudo, which was built in 1861).

Narita Brand Ambassador

The 13th Generation Ichikawa Danjurou Hakuen

Since the middle Edo Period, the Ichikawa family has been connected with Naritasan Shinshoji Temple through the religion of Fudo. Kabuki actor Danjurou Ichikawa, who is well-known to the people of Narita because he has often come to the city to, for example, participate in events commemorating the founding of Naritasan in the year 1080 or attend the Setsubun Close-of-Winter Festival, was named "Narita Brand Ambassador." Through Danjurou's work in helping to continue Japan's traditional performing arts and culture, he is spreading the word about Narita's attractions.



The bustling temple town is reminiscent of Old Edo.

The 800-meter-long road that leads from the JR/Keisei Narita Station to Somon Gate of Naritasan Shinshoji Temple is lined with buildings that even today harken back to the days of Old Edo.

Designated as Japan Heritage*

Along with Sakura, Katori, and Choshi, Narita has been designated as Japan Heritage, as an "Edo adventure in the 4 cities of Hokusō" — where one can get a feeling for Old Edo in Hokusō street scenes." Narita, where there are historically sacred sites and vestiges of old street scenes, is the site closest to the airport where you can experience the atmosphere of Old Edo.

*What is Japan Heritage?

To help vitalize local communities, the Agency for Cultural Affairs officially designates stories that tell about Japan's culture and tradition through their special character and historical attractiveness as Japan Heritage.



Selections for Naritabi sightseeing

There are many fortunetelling spots in the Okuyama Hiroba plaza at Naritasan. People line up to have their futures told by popular fortunetellers.

Praying for success in life
It is said that offering a candle and a piece of aburage, a favorite food of foxes, to the shrine will lead to success in life.

Medications
Since the old Edo Period, Narita medications have been popular with pilgrims as "wonder drugs." This is especially true for "Ichiryu-gan," a stomach medicine that is still in great demand.

Checking the latest information
The Narita Tourist Pavilion is a center for tourist information in the Narita area. It also features a traditional dashi float and other exhibits.

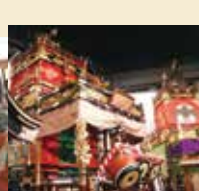
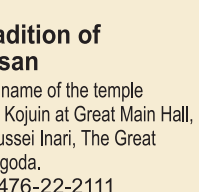
Experience the tradition of Goshuin at Naritasan

The Narita Tourist Pavilion features not only exhibits of huge dashi floats being towed around during the Narita Gion Festival, but also sightseeing videos and information about various other events. So please stop by and find out what Narita has to offer.

Great Main Hall
Great main Hall was completed in 1968. The principal image is Fudo-Myoo, whose figure was consecrated by the priest Kobo-Daishi. There is a holy fire for invocation in this hall. Talismans and prayer charms are sold on the 1st floor, and scapegoat talismans are received in the east and west rooms of the 2nd floor.

Great Peace Pagoda
This solemn structure is a 58-meter-high Buddhist pagoda. The architecture of the double estrade and 5-level interior symbolizes the teachings of Shingon Esoteric Buddhism.

Shakado Hall
Built in 1858, the old main hall still conveys features of its late Edo Period origins. Around the temple are sculptures such as Gohyakuraku (Five Hundred Disciples of the Buddha) and Niujyun-ko (24 filial exemplars). Visitors come here to pray to ward off bad luck.

Komyodo Hall
The old main hall was built in 1701. The main icon is that of the Dainichi Buddha, and the fire deity Fudo-Myoo and Aizen-Myoo (prayer for marriage) are enshrined here.

Niomon Gate
There are two imposing statues, "Vermillion Deva Kings," one on either side of the 19-meter-high gate, which serve to protect the temple.

Iouden Pagoda
This pagoda, which was built completely of cypress wood in 2018 as a project to commemorate the founding of Naritasan in 1080, is a place to pray for recovery from illness, and for health and long life.

Somon Gate
The gate is made of zelkova wood. Images of eight principal guardians such as the deity Fudo Myoo are enshrined on the gate.

Unagi

Narita is blessed with excellent freshwater fishing sites at the Tone River and Lake Imba. Once renowned for eel restaurants, eel dishes are still one of Narita's famous products. Eel is lightly broiled using traditional methods, then is grilled after brushing with a sweet soy sauce. Kimosui, eel liver soup is a highly nutritious delicacy.

This street is famous for unagi eel products.
Common people during the Edo Period needed two days to walk the 64 kilometers from Edo (Tokyo) to Narita. Highly nutritious eel was eaten to relieve fatigue. Today, Numerous eel restaurants line the roughly 800m Omotesando walkway to Naritasan.

Naritasan Shinshoji Temple

Naritasan Shinshoji Temple is the head temple of Shingonshu sect and is affectionately known as "Narita's O-Fudo-sama." The top-ranked of the "Big Three" temples of the Kanto region, it is visited by about 10 million people each year. In 1980, 5 important religious structures from relatively modern times were designated as important cultural properties: Komyodo Hall and Shakado Hall, which were formerly the main building, and the Three-storied Pagoda, Niomon Gate, and Gakudo Hall.



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Sake
Local sake rice wines are brewed from spring water bubbling from the Narita Aquifer and Chiba rice using highly refined traditional methods.

Teppozuke (Pickles)
Teppozuke is a popular pickle made by stuffing green cayenne peppers wrapped in shiso leaves into hollowed-out uri melons.

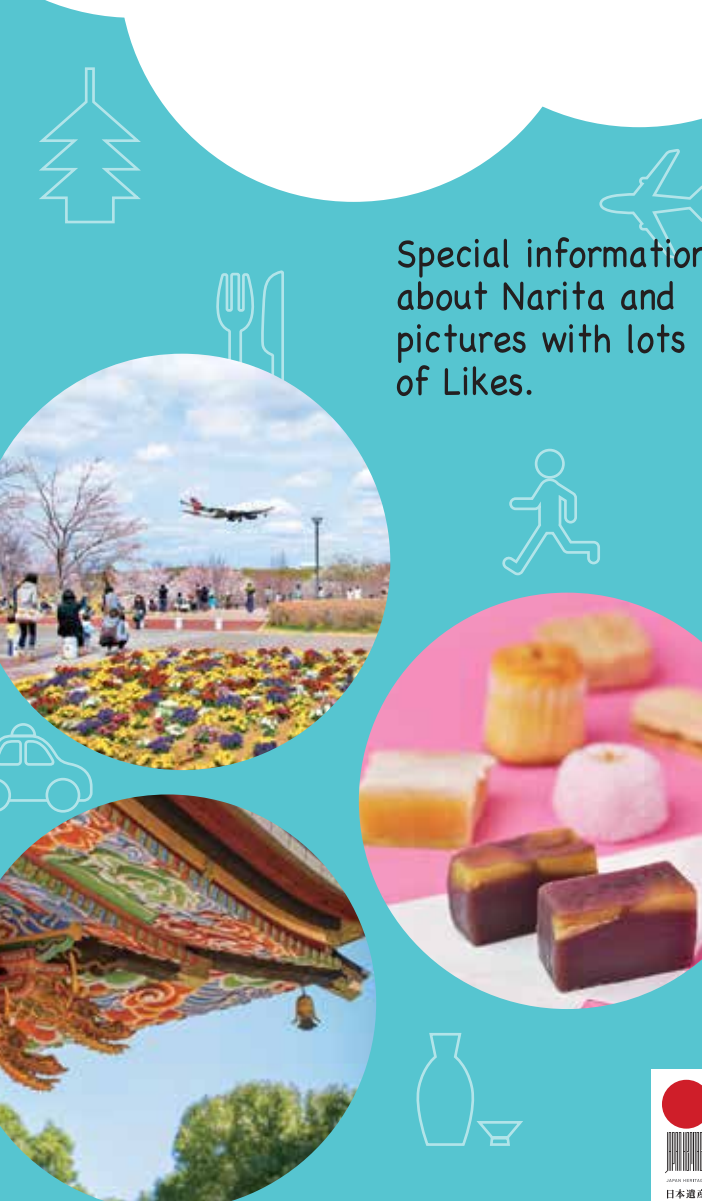
Yokan and other Japanese sweets
Yokan, gelled sweet bean treats, is said to have originated from the vegetarian diet at Shinshoji Temple during the Meiji Era. With its superior sweetness and rich taste, it has become one of Narita's most popular souvenir products. Other popular Narita treats include Manju (buns with bean-jam filling) and rice cakes.

Tsukudani
Tsukudani are foods boiled in sweet soy sauce. Narita, which is blessed with good fishing spots like Lake Imba, makes many freshwater fish products.

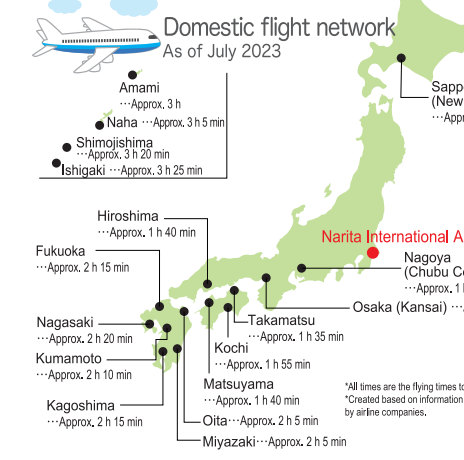

Naritabi sightseeing starts at Narita International Airport, which connects all of Japan with the world.

"Narita International Airport, which serves as Japan's gateway to the world, also features excellent domestic flights. The airport is not only a strategic transportation point for Naritabi sightseeing, it is in itself a marvelous "airport sightseeing spot", where visitors can enjoy shopping, fine dining, art and panoramic views, among other things.



Every day, there are about 700 departures and arrivals at the airport, and the number of airport passengers has risen to more than 40 million per year. The airport also supports industry as a focal point for the international distribution of goods.

In fiscal 2015, the Number 3 Terminal at Narita Airport won the Good Design Grand Award of the Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry. The new terminal is helping to make air travel easier and more enjoyable.

There is an observation deck on the 5th floor of Terminal 1 and the 4th floor of Terminal 2. People never get tired of watching jets taking off and landing one after another.

Spots for photographing airplanes

Narita City Sakura-no-Yama Park and Sora-no-Eki Sakura-kan
MAP C-5/4 ☎0476-33-3309

This is a small but tall hill bordering on the airport. Chosen as one of the 100 best panoramic spots in Chiba, it is often used in filming for television. At the "Sora no Eki Sakura-kan" within the grounds, there are shops that sell things like vegetables and local specialty goods, as well as facilities such as restaurants, a tourist information center, and shops for light goods.

Sanrizuka Sakura-no-Oka Park

In addition to facilities such as an observation deck, control tower, and maintenance area, this is a popular spot for getting close-up views of airplanes taking off and landing.

Toyomi Shinonome-no-Oka Park
MAP C-4/13

Narita Airport's B runway is very close by, making this a highly recommended spot for feeling the power of aircraft as they come and go.

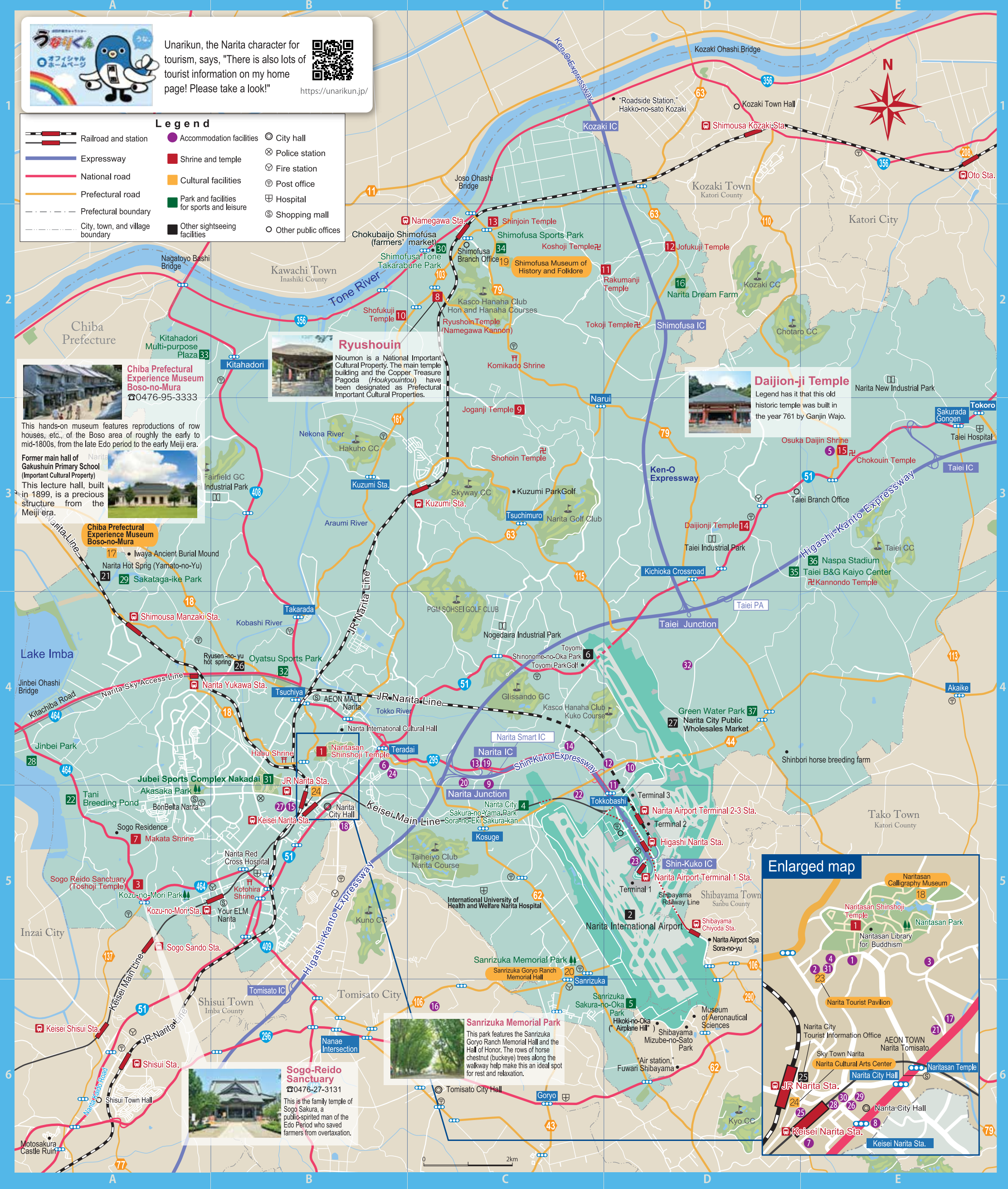
